



The Colour of Mehndi

He was the very embodiment of politeness

Reading some years ago about the famous singer, Daler Mehndi, being branded a "proclaimed offender", I was reminded of my own interaction with him in 1995. It was a classic study of how people could change. Or do they really, considering that the police hastily withdrew the case against him.

Our son was to be married that November. We had heard about this rising singer and decided to book him for the 'Sangeet' festivities. It was to be a glittering event, jointly hosted by the parents of the bride and groom. We called on Mehndi around May and booked him for the grand sum of Rs. 25,000; 10,000 was paid in advance. In addition to the balance of 15,000, he would of course pick up the "varna" (money generally circled around the youngsters' head by their elders and then given to performers).

Around August, a prominent daily carried a report on this emerging new star and how he was commanding fees of over a lakh at weddings. We were alarmed. Our budget didn't permit such a large sum and I didn't see how he would do it for less with all the bookings at his command. We decided to call on him.

As we reached the modest home, there was the great Mehndi himself – clad in a lungi and vest – to greet us at the door. "Aao ji, ji aayan noo (please come, welcome)," he said in chaste Punjabi. "Tuadi ki seva kar sakda (what can I do for you)?" The guy was politeness personified. Tea and snacks awaited us in the small sitting room. We were wondering if the warm welcome was genuine or a prelude to a shocker.

We came straight to the point. Our booking had been made several months ago and the agreed rate was Rs. 25,000. We'd read that he was now charging over one lakh. We hoped he would honour his commitment. All through our monologue, Mehndi heard us with an amused expression. Once we had finished, he spoke – even more politely than before, "Tusi sochya vi kiven ke main apna vada nahin nibhavan ga. Ik wari jo gal ho gayi ho gayi. Main tuada show pachi hazaar wich karanga chahe meri fees panj lakh ho jave. Wahe guru nain chaha te jaldi ho joye qi" (How could you even think that I'd not keep my promise? A commitment's a commitment. I'll do your show for 25,000 even if my rate becomes five lakh. God willing it will soon).

We heaved a collective sigh of relief. Here was a gentleman who respected values. He wanted all the money in the world – indeed was confident of earning big fees – but wouldn't compromise on ethics. "He will surely go far," we told ourselves, as we trooped out, once again escorted by Mehndi.

Mehndi and his troupe came to our venue around 8 pm. It was at 2 am that they had to be smuggled out of a back door because the youngsters just

couldn't have enough of their song-and-dance routine. The humble sardar thankfully accepted our balance of Rs. 15,000. It is another story that the varna probably added up to another 25,000.

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Want to Learn How Things Really Work at Your New Job? Talk to the People at the Bottom

New research shows that people of all ranks look to low-level peers for information about organizational social norms.

What are typical work hours here?

Do teammates do things together outside work?

If I have an idea for changing something, what's the best way to raise it?

Those are questions a new member of any organizational team might have.

How they get those questions answered has been a topic of interest to Dale T. Miller, Stanford Graduate School of Business professor of organizational behavior; Jennifer Dannalsopen in new window, who received her PhD from Stanford GSB in 2018 and is now an assistant professor at the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth; and Emily Reit, a current Stanford GSB doctoral student.



"A common assumption is that people just copy the behavior of the highest-ranking leaders in a group, rather than paying attention to anyone else," Dannals says. "That's always rubbed me the wrong way, partly because I hadn't done that as a PhD student within the academic hierarchy. I believed lower-ranked people matter more in our perceptions of social norms."

"Clearly, leaders have many avenues of influence," Miller says. "But in this case, we thought lower-ranking people might have an advantage."

Dannals, Miller, and Reit developed a series of studiesopen in new window to understand where people in a group look for information on behavioral norms. Their research, which informs our understanding of broader organizational culture, is important because firms use culture to motivate employees and align them with strategy. Moreover, culture can be tied both to positive behavior and to the not-so-positive variety, such as unethical actions.

"The social norms we considered here are like the building blocks or 'micro-processes' of organizational culture," Dannals says.

As hypothesized, the researchers found that individuals — at both higher and lower ranks — seek information from lower-level peers, because they see these individuals as more attentive to social norms.

Who's Your Reference Group?

The researchers studied processes around group social norms from multiple angles.

Importantly, they first had to create definitions of social groups and rank. Here, they decided to focus on a given individual's "reference group," or the people they saw as roughly similar to themselves within the broader group.

"When I talk about this research, people often imagine a 200-person corporation, with assistants and custodial staff as the lowest level," Dannals says. "But it's about the people more at your general level. So if you're in top management of a business, your reference group would be the rest of the top team. If you're on the custodial staff, then it's the rest of that staff. Not the entire corporate hierarchy."

Dannals herself, as a new professor, says her reference group would most likely be other assistant professors or non-tenured faculty within her area.

The researchers also had to think about how people gain norm-related information. For example, they considered that people new to an organization or group might approach others explicitly for advice on behavioral norms, or they may rely primarily on observations of their coworkers. "Either way, they're trying to get a sense of what's appropriate," Dannals says.

Looking to Lower-Level Peers

However we define our reference groups and seek information within them, the researchers hypothesized that we look to lowest-level peers for behavioral cues — even when we ourselves are higher-ranking.

That's largely because lower-level people are "subject to situational pressures in a way that higher-ranking members aren't," Dannals says. "Higher-level people may be able to get away with doing whatever, so



they may pay less attention to norms."

The team used multiple related studies to get at whether and why group members go to lower-level peers to get enlightened about cultural norms. In one, the researchers asked employees from a midsized West Coast advertising firm whom they'd recommend in their reference group for information about social norms. A second study asked participants to imagine themselves as high-ranking lab members and then requested they choose an advisor from individuals at higher and lower ranks, with the belief they'd actually be working with that person. A third placed participants in the role of a new marketing team member and asked which colleagues they would trust most for advice on organizational culture, and why.

The Challenge of Cultural Change

The findings converged around several key insights.

First, people do generally seek information on behavioral norms from lower-ranked peers within their reference group, as predicted. Moreover, individuals do this primarily because they perceive lower-level people as more attentive to social norms than others might be, rather than because they see themselves as more similar to these information sources or think lower-level people will be more honest.

It's important to note that while the current research highlights lower-level group members as go-to information sources, it doesn't necessarily mean they are the *most accurate* sources. "We've only looked at who people in general think has the best information about social norms," Dannals says. "We're going to follow up this research with a project

assessing who actually has the best perception; that can be a trickier question to answer."

The results have multiple implications. For one, as Dannals notes, "It's encouraging to know that people at lower ranks can have more of an impact on organizational culture in some cases than leadership; it suggests the power of a grassroots approach."

At the same time, however, that the keenest insight about an organization's culture is seen as residing mostly in lower-level people may suggest a challenge for leadership. "It's going to be difficult for leaders to change cultures — even toxic ones — alone," Dannals says. "That's because their behaviors or statements will be measured against those of lower-ranking people, who might be thinking that it's cheap talk. In general, the behavior of lower-level people in organizations may be stickier than leaders might want."

In line with this, Miller encourages leaders to look at lower-ranked colleagues' behaviors to identify and modify group norms: "They may be overweighting the behavior of fellow leaders. Getting lower-level people on board may buy them more influence than they realize."

Still, that's not to say all culture-related power rests in the lower ranks.

"This is one organizational lever that can be pulled to change culture," Dannals says. "Others are things like whom you hire, fire, reward, and promote. Those send big messages, so you need to think about all the weights on the scale and how they come together to affect culture."

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How Working Parents Can Create a New Normal for Their Family

Summary.

Millions of working parents have endured nonstop waves of challenges and change during the Covid-19 pandemic. Now, as many face the return to the workplace, there is hope of a "return to pre-pandemic lives." But there a lot of apprehension in figuring out what this next transition holds — and what we want it to hold — after a year and a half of carefully constructing a new balance and reality. As you face this next transition, it's important to take the time and create a future that works for you, taking into consideration what you experienced during the pandemic. Draw a timeline of the months during the pandemic and mark the highs and lows. Circle the highs that you want to preserve and put an X next to the lows that need to change moving forward. Finally, outline ways that you can preserve the meaningful moments in your highs moving forward and adjust your schedule accordingly as you transition back into the workplace.

We met Amir and Ria last spring, just as the pandemic was upending lives, pushing working parents to scramble and ask: How can we possibly navigate so much upheaval with such little support? And how do we create a new normal that works for all of us?

In the ensuing 18+ months, millions of parents around the world endured nonstop waves of challenges and change. Now, at least in parts of North America and Europe, there is hope of a "return to prepandemic lives" this fall. But the reality we're



returning to looks nothing like what we left. Millions have had to leave the workforce, especially mothers. And companies have a wide range of expectations in how and where the work needs to get done.

The result is a lot of apprehension in figuring out what this next transition holds and, importantly, what we want it to hold, after a year and a half of carefully constructing a new balance and reality.

Most of us were so busy with keeping our heads above water — at home and at work — that we haven't had the opportunity to properly reflect on the good, the bad, the never-want-to-think-about-let-alone-live-it-again. But as you face this next transition, it's important to take the time and create a future that works for you, taking into consideration what you experienced during the pandemic. I recommend creating a map of the past year and a half to guide what your future might include. This exercise allows us to honestly acknowledge which parts are worth keeping and which we want to discard.

What you'll need:

- a white piece of paper (if you're doing as a couple or family, you can each make your own, or use a huge piece of paper to fit everyone's in)
- markers, crayons, pens
- photos (whatever you store your pictures on, like your phone)
- calendar or planner of the past year's events and meetings

Start with a map. Draw a horizontal line across the middle of your paper as a timeline, and create ticks to mark January 2020 to September 2021. Now, pull out your photos and calendars, and go through them month by month. Allow yourself to go back in time and feel the feelings of that frantic first March. The eerie but calm quiet of the global shutdown

— and the discomfort that came along with it. The frustration and fear as the pandemic continued through holidays, birthdays, and other events. The unevenness of reopening. The schooling and work challenges. The joyful friend calls. The loss.

Mark the high points and the low points, month by month. As you do, consider three different lenses: routines, rituals, and relationships. Routines are the regular events like school pickups or commutes. Rituals are the things we enjoy and attach meaning to, like family video calls and Sunday dinners. Relationships are the most critical ones with a partner, kids, family, friends, and yourself, but it can also include professional relationships — a particularly supportive manager on a collaborative work project or a colleague that persists in frustrating exchanges — and any relationships via social media. How did it feel to engage on Instagram or Twitter during this time?

Be as detailed as you want, but this exercise is less about completeness and more of a way to honestly reflect and remember. Add colors, images, doodles, whatever you want; this is your family's map of your experience.

Focus on the most meaningful. Circle the highs you want to preserve and put an X next to the lows you want to change.

For the highs, what were unexpected high points? These might have been weekly video calls with family and friends, and feeling more connected than you have in a long time. It might have been forming a support network with a couple of close families. It might have been more personal — finding interests and strengths you hadn't explored before.

On the other side, what was challenging and that you absolutely need to change? For instance, no commute, working from home all the time, zero




travel. How do you want to bring that back? If you realized you missed the quiet and ritual of a commute but will be still working from home a couple days a week, can you create a mock commute to the cafe and back before starting work each morning? If you missed time with friends, can you schedule a monthly dinner?

Mapping Your Past to Plan Your Future

Don't let what you've learned from the pandemic get lost as you transition back into the workplace. The following exercise and example (based on my own family's experience) can help you assess which parts are worth keeping and which to discard. To get started, gather paper, writing tools, your photos or smartphone, and a calendar, and follow the steps below.





Look forward. Think of the next six months. What's expected to change? At work, at school, in your activities, at home? What is your ideal of what it would look like? How can you advocate for something as close to that as possible? How might the highs you circled be preserved with some modifications?

For example, maybe weekly video calls with family turn into monthly calls. Morning walks before school and work become evening walks. Think about how to preserve the time for regular workouts or how to simplify your home logistics (keeping everyone less scheduled or creating opportunities with more coverage with both parents working from home). Perhaps you'll choose to limit extracurricular activities to only one or two, or choose one that the whole family does together. Maybe you want to keep weekly potlucks with your pandemic pod. Then, start to plan your transition and return with these ideas in mind.

The goal of this exercise is two-fold: to drive intentionality in your life choices and to help you feel more in control of your choices over periods of transition. This is not about going back or returning, nor is it about making up for lost time. It's about entering a new chapter. A new phase. We've developed skills and instincts and lessons that our older and wiser selves can use. It's yet another moment of transition. But just as we navigated the wild unknowns of the past year and a half, with the right map, we have what we need to intentionally navigate the next.






